Leadership Team REFLECTIONS 2019

For our December meeting, the Leadership Team paused from our usual business to reflect on this year. We asked ourselves, as a church and a congregation, "What are some things that we have done well? What are our growing edges?

We saw that we work to make everyone welcome. We have worked to welcome new people. We wonder how we might best reach out and help them, and all, to find meaning in their experiences here. We know we can work to be more welcoming. We hope to include more ethnically and racially diverse images.

Our worship services are inspiring, comforting, creative, and amazing. Our worship is often complemented by beautiful PowerPoint presentations. People are sitting closer to the front, a goal we set a few years ago. Our choir and orchestra make a joyful noise to the Lord. Taught and coached by members of our congregation, young musicians provide special music. The Bear Creek banners help to tell our love story for God as they now hang in our sanctuary.

We offer a Prayer Blanket Ministry. We gather in prayer asking God to meet that person's needs over a blanket. We then present the blanket to the person to serve as a reminder of our prayers and God's love for them during their challenging time.

Sunday School classes for both adults and children allow us to gather around God's word in community. Our newly hired Early Childhood Education (infant-3rd grade) staff, Alex and Kayla, provide children's church, meaningful worship for the youngest in our congregation. We are also piloting a volunteer led 4-6th grade children's church to do the same for our older children.

We must acknowledge that we have had a few instances in which spoken words have hurt a child or an adult. We regret these instances and remain committed to providing support to those involved. We hope and pray that we can all communicate lovingly with each other.

Our grounds and our building are well-maintained by volunteers who quietly work to provide us clean and useful worship and work spaces. Other volunteers meet needs without seeking any acknowledgment. We are a caring and giving Church family. When we become aware of a need, we work to find a solution to people's concerns.

Concerned about maintaining a strong, vibrant church, about 1/3rd of our congregation participated in a retreat activity called the Twelve Scriptures Project, our first steps in evaluating our Church's Mission and Vision statement. These results and strategies such as those found in the book, *The Scrappy Church*, will help us discern God's will in the life of our church.

We are involved beyond the walls of our church. Through the Trotwood Neighborhood Transformation and our own Outreach and Witness ministries, we participate in community activities such as a hot dog roast or litter pick up. After the Memorial Day Tornado, we worked with Threads of Miami Valley to collect donations to share with Tornado Survivors. We hope to involve more members of our congregation in our community ministries. For those of us in leadership roles, we recognize we need help in delegating roles to others. We also participate with other congregations in many activities such as Vacation Bible School, Love Feast, Blue Christmas and Welcoming Advent.

We are blessed to be supported by a phenomenal staff. Our Administrative Assistant, Judy Gainey, is invested as a participant in our church. She problem solves being primarily pro-active. She is uniquely organized and creative. Our Pastor, Jennifer Keeney Scarr, leads our congregation with amazing pastoral care, with creative programming, and with insightful Bible Study and worship.

Our building is under-utilized in that it stands empty much of the week. We also would like to fill some leadership positions. We need more deacons and Sunday School teachers. We also have a vacancy in the position of Clerk. We prayerfully seek ways to address these concerns.

to serve January 1, 2020-December 31, 2022

Our TCoB Leadership Team seeks a Member of our congregation to answer the call to serve in the capacity of our church's clerk. Here are the descriptions of the position as found on page 8 in our Polity and Procedure:

- Lines 4 & 5: *Clerk Function*: The Clerk shall keep minutes for the Council and Leadership Team.
- Lines 12 & 13: *Eligibility*: All Officers shall be Members of the Church of the Brethren, whether from this congregation or another.
- Lines 15-17: A person shall be called as on Officer for a term of three years. At the end of each term, the Leadership Facilitator and/or Pastor shall check with the incumbent to see if he or she is willing to continue or will need a break.
- Line 21: The officers above shall also be the legal officers of this organization.

The Leadership Team generally meets at 6:30pm on the 3rd Tuesday of most months. Council meets once a year in the last quarter of the year and as needed.


